"It's been a lot of work, but it's the type of thing this board wants to be involved in for the community."

The station, which consists only of card troll fuel pumps, will be owned by the Economic Development board, but there is a 15 year lease from the North Central Farmers Elevator to provide the fuel service. All types of fuel will be available from diesel, E-85, and other ethanol blends. Peterson explained the project was made possible with grant money and funding from various sources.

The pumps and tanks were acquired through a grant from the Governor's Office of Economic Development. Other money was obtained through financing from Rural Electric, Grow SD and NECOG. Frederick had a fuel service for years under several different owners at the now closed fuel station on Main Street, but has been without fuel for several years. It is hoped the pumps will be up and running by October, but certainly by the end of the year.

Community Store Expands Selection Fresh Meat Now Available

The Frederick Community Store has partnered with Ken's SuperFair Foods to provide a selection of fresh meat to their customers.

One of the concerns the Community Store Board has heard is that fresh meat isn't available.

In July, some of the board members met with Kevin Fiedler at Ken's SuperFair Foods in Aberdeen. He agreed to work with the store to provide fresh meat for the store's meat cooler. The packages are cryovaced, a packaging technology that allows fresh goods to be kept fresher for longer.

"It's great that we can work with a reputable grocer like Ken's to provide good, quality meat for the community," Roger Nixon, board chairman said. "By using this special process, the meat should last longer on our shelves without going out of condition."

The process for the cryovac-packaged meat says it can be good for up to two weeks. Frozen cryovac-packaged meat remains good for up to a year. The board is pleased to be able to offer these choices for the community. Many of the people have cattle and so will butcher an animal so they have meat available in their freezer. This gives an option to pick up some fresh pork or beef. Fiedler is working with the store so that the meat is only slightly higher than what is available to the main Ken's store in Aberdeen.

For now, a limited amount of meat will be available on the shelves. If you know you want some pork chops, steaks, 85 percent lean hamburger, pork

or beef roasts, call the Community Store at

329-2375 by noon on Mondays to request items. There is also a sign-up sheet at the store. Meat is delivered after noon on Wednesdays.

The board thanks the community for their support. The balance sheet is improving because of the people who are making a point to stop in to pick up groceries. The Store couldn't continue without the community and the wonderful volunteers. Let Karen Brotzel know if you can help for a few hours. The board is also working with Ken's to improve fresh produce. Let us know what fruits/vegetables you'd like to see offered.

The store would like to offer fresh, locally grown produce for sale. Check with Donanne if you have some you'd like to share. Ken's would also be able to provide fresh baked goods. Is that something customers would like to see? Input from customers is always important. Let us know what you'd like to see offered.
