Summer has come and gone and by the time you are reading this; we will be entering our third week of the 2017-18 school year. We held our annual "Open House" on August 15th and had a nice turnout. I would encourage all parents to attend our yearly open houses so you can meet your children's teachers and get a first-hand look at our school. Welcome back, the Frederick Area School is off to a great start! New students are excitedly arriving, new technology is being deployed, and new curriculum is being utilized to drive student success. No matter how new everything is though, this remains true; students who regularly attend school have a higher success rate than those who are chronically absent.

September is Attendance Awareness Month. Showing up for school has a huge impact on a student's academic success, starting in kindergarten and continuing through high school. Even as children grow older and more independent, families play a key role in making sure students get to school safely every day and understand why attendance is so important for success in school and in life.

We realize some absences are unavoidable. But we also know that when students miss too much school—regardless of the reason—it can cause them to fall behind academically. Research shows that children who are chronically absent in kindergarten and 1st grade are much less likely to read at grade level by the end of 3rd grade. By 6th grade, chronic absence is a proven early warning sign for students at risk for dropping out of school. By 9th grade, good attendance can predict graduation rates better than 8th grade test scores.

Clearly, going to school regularly matters. Here are few tips to help families maintain regular school attendance:

- Make sure students have a bedtime and morning routine.
- Ensure your student goes to school every day unless he/she is truly sick.
- Avoid scheduling vacations or doctor appointments during school hours.
- Talk with teachers if your child is feeling anxious about coming to school.

I am excited to be to working with your children throughout the year and thank you for your partnership in getting them to school. If you ever have any concerns, please reach out to myself, teachers, or other staff. We want to make this year a great one for all!

# TOWN OF FREDERICK

## August 7, 2017

The Frederick Town Board meeting began Monday evening, August 7, 2017, at 7 PM, with Board Members Troy Millard and Gary Schlosser, Finance Officer Diane Bruns, Historical Society members Mitch Mikkonen and Janet Burkhardt, Frederick Forward members Donna Sumption and Krysti Mikkonen,

Robert Campbell and Jerry Cedar.

Board Member Troy Millard called the meeting to order and led in the Pledge of Allegiance. The July minutes were read and approved with motion by GS/TM. Motion Carried. Enter Chairman Scott Campbell whom resumed leadership. The Financial Report for July with July's Accounts Receivable and Bank Fund Balances were approved with a motion by TM/GS. Motion Carried.

The Accounts Payable for August were approved with a motion by GS/TM. Motion Carried.

Utility Manager Rich Bakeberg was absent for a Utility Report.

Gallon difference was noted but will be rechecked next month. Two fire hydrants w/leaks have been replaced and another leak has been found and repaired.

Every-one agreed Finn Fest was a success.

A motion was made to join US Communities to purchase playground equipment for Simmons Park under the city's name but for Frederick Forward. The city will be reimbursed by Frederick Forward as noted by Donna Sumption and Krysti Mikkonen. Mikkonen mentioned there may be another grant for more equipment. Motion was made by TM/GS. Motion Carried. Both ladies commented on all the volunteers that have

offered to help place the equipment in the park, free of charge. FO also needs to check on what portion of the Port-a-Potties during Finn Fest, the city agreed to pay.

The Historical Society will be holding a City Wide Rummage Sale on Saturday, August 12, 2017 in Frederick.

Mitch Mikkonen presented bills for the sidewalk and ramp installed in front of the Historical building wondering if the city would pay part of it since the city owns the building. Sidewalk installation and water pipe repair was approved by the Historical Society board.

No report from Emma Burnham Library. Items taken by Sheriff's department after break-in have been returned but no report or follow-up has been received.

### OTHER OLD BUSINESS:

Discussion w/audience input was held on the

forthcoming cost increase for WEB Water gallons. It was explained that even if the full 2000 gallons are not used, everyone has to pay the basic charge to replace pipes and make upgrades to water lines. Another question was why customers past 2 months overdue are not shut off? To keep up with the increase from WEB Water, the Town of Frederick will raise the basic charge of \$25 for the 1st 2000 gallons to \$27 for the 1st 2000 gallons used. There will also be an increase from \$2.50 to \$3.00 for each 1000 gallons over the basic 1st 2000 gallons. Motion to increase minimum usage + overage was made by TM/SC. Roll Call vote Campbell Aye; Schlosser Aye; Millard Aye; Motion Carried.

A question was raised about sidewalks being completed on the rest of the block on Main Street, from the end of the new sidewalk in front of the Historical Society building to the corner of 3rd Avenue. No Action taken.

Vacated alleyways and city limit issues have been resolved, Ag land in the Frederick city limits is taxed at the same levy as the Frederick Township; Auditor Roger Schnabel is coming to the Community Center on the 22nd of August to issue guidance; Frederick WW Study complete report from Helms and Associates was noted (each board member received a hard copy of the report); DOT Grant Program for elevator road was tabled.

### NEW BUSINESS:

The problem of unleashed dogs wandering out of their own yards was presented to Board by local citizen. The Aberdeen Dog Catchers have been notified and the Sheriff's office has talked to the owners. Another new dog to the neighborhood has been brought to the attention of the Board. ALL DOGS in Frederick need to have their rabbi shots, a Frederick Town dog license attained at the Finance Office and ALWAYS be on a leash.

Helms and Associates requested water numbers for the last two years.

Mid-year balances for 2017 were presented for reference in the upcoming Budget.

Budget Request Sample form was reviewed.

Stop Sign replacement in Frederick will be noted and signs replaced in near future.

### CORRESPONDENCE:

Bulldoze, Build and Beautify plans with NECOG have been postponed due to the short time line. SDWWA 2017 Annual Conference September 13-15, 2017, was noted. The 84th Annual "Growing Communities from the People UP" Conference in Sioux Falls on October 3-6 was noted. JM Electric will repair the exhaust fan in the Community Center.

NOTICE: The September meeting will be held on Wednesday, September 6, 2017, 7 PM in the Frederick Community Center. Have a Safe and Happy Labor Day weekend.

### ADJOURNMENT:

There being no further business, the meeting was adjourned at 8:15 PM with a motion by TM/GS. Motion Carried. The next Town Board meeting is Wednesday, September 6, 2017. The Finance Office number is 605-329-2242, answered 24/7.

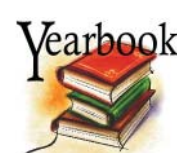
